



Big Picture Indicators of Success by 2025

- ♦ Hold population decline to less than the projected rate of 2.7%
- Raise Per Capita Personal Income and Median Family Income to be equal to the state average
 - ♦ That the percent of people living in poverty be equal to or less than the state average
- ◆ That 60% of the population age 25—64 hold quality educational credentials or college degrees
- ♦ That Gross Assessed Valuation increases year-to-year at a rate at least equal to the state average.
