

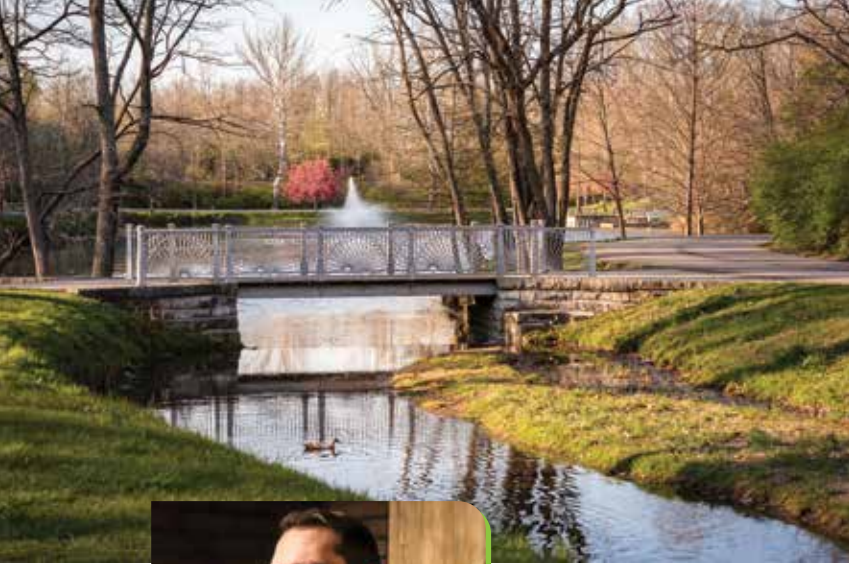


# WAYNE COUNTY FOUNDATION

ANNUAL REPORT 2020







## Dear Wayne County Foundation Friends,

What a year it has been! Although we could not predict the impacts of the pandemic, we were not surprised with the outpouring of support given to meet the needs of so many in our community. Your gifts supported organizations that grew their services and addressed basic needs; supported arts organizations that delivered experiences adapted to minimize health risks; and you supported the Wayne County Cares Fund that was used to help families that lost jobs and income due to the pandemic. Your gifts helped to meet the urgent needs of 2020 and will support the initiatives that will strengthen Wayne County.

- **THE 2020 CHALLENGE MATCH** had 49 participating organizations that raised over \$1.57 million from the community to trigger \$265,000 in matching funds from the Foundation for a total contributed **BENEFIT OF OVER \$1.83 MILLION**.
- **THE FOUNDATION AWARDED NEARLY \$2.25 MILLION** in grants, distributions, and scholarships, including \$85,300 in Wayne County Cares Fund grants and \$16,833 in Covid-19 Crisis Relief grants.
- **LILLY ENDOWMENT INC.** (LEI) GIFT VII Community Leadership Matching grant program was completed. Through your generosity, **\$900,000 WAS RAISED AND TRIGGERED A \$1M MATCH** from LEI.
- We celebrated **100% BOARD GIVING** that triggered an additional **GIFT OF \$100,000** from LEI to be used for grantmaking.
- Finally, we were **AWARDED A \$150,000** LEI GIFT VII Implementation grant to conduct community leadership projects through Forward Wayne County

We are optimistic in 2021. Organizations are launching new programming and community events are being planned. At the Foundation, we have launched a strategic planning process that aims to focus our work, prioritize community need, and create impact with our grantmaking activities. Additionally, our community leadership initiative, Forward Wayne County, is leading several county-wide initiatives to increase Quality of Place and Workforce Readiness.

Projects include: a career awareness campaign for in-demand jobs in Wayne County that will encourage individuals to re-engage with the workforce or increase educational attainment, growing interest in individuals engaging with their neighborhoods using the NICE! framework (Neighborhood Involvement and Community Engagement), development work with Main Street groups, and increasing the broadband access across our county.

We hope the stories on the following pages serve to illustrate the impact of the Foundation's work throughout Wayne County and show what can be accomplished when people care enough to give generously to support their charitable interests.

# A CONCERT *for a Cause*

No one could have predicted a world turned upside down in 2020, but it is during the toughest times that you learn the most about your community...

The Wayne County Cares Fund was established in April 2020 as the Foundation’s direct response to combat the effects of the COVID-19 global pandemic in our community. Thanks to many generous donors, over \$120,000 was raised for the fund to help those most vulnerable to the adverse impact of the crisis.

One of the largest donations came from the efforts of someone who was also greatly impacted during this time.

Local musician Sean Lamb, a Cambridge City native, was accustomed to traveling across the state and Midwest to play concerts. He soon discovered that with many venues closing down, he needed to improvise if he wanted to continue performing. So he began livestreaming virtual concerts on Facebook, which quickly gained momentum. After the Foundation announced plans to start the Wayne County Cares Fund, including an opportunity to have gifts matched dollar-for-dollar, Lamb gathered a group of his musician friends to throw a benefit concert on April 17, 2020, to help raise money for the relief fund.

Lamb, who has been playing music nearly his entire life, partnered with the Foundation because he said he knew the funds would be well-stewarded and that they would stay in the county and help those most in need.

What he didn’t anticipate was the runaway success the event would be.

“

‘I thought we’d raise \$1,000 at the most. We kept track of the donations and would share the number with the viewers. At times, it almost felt like a telethon because the number kept growing and growing.’

By the end of the night, 14,000 people had tuned in and the concert had raised nearly \$17,000 for COVID-19 relief. After donating to another charity, Lamb brought \$5,600 of the funds raised to the Foundation – which was promptly

matched dollar-for-dollar – for a total gift of \$11,200.

‘These are our people,’ Lamb said when talking about the gift. ‘And we need to take care of the people who take care of us.’

‘Never in a million years would I have guessed that we could raise that. But that’s how much this community cares.’

## COVID-19 CRISIS RESPONSE GRANTS

In addition to the Wayne County Cares Fund, the Wayne County Foundation also utilized COVID-19 Crisis Response Grants, which were aimed to embolden and prioritize the work of our local nonprofit partners working on the frontlines with families affected by the pandemic.

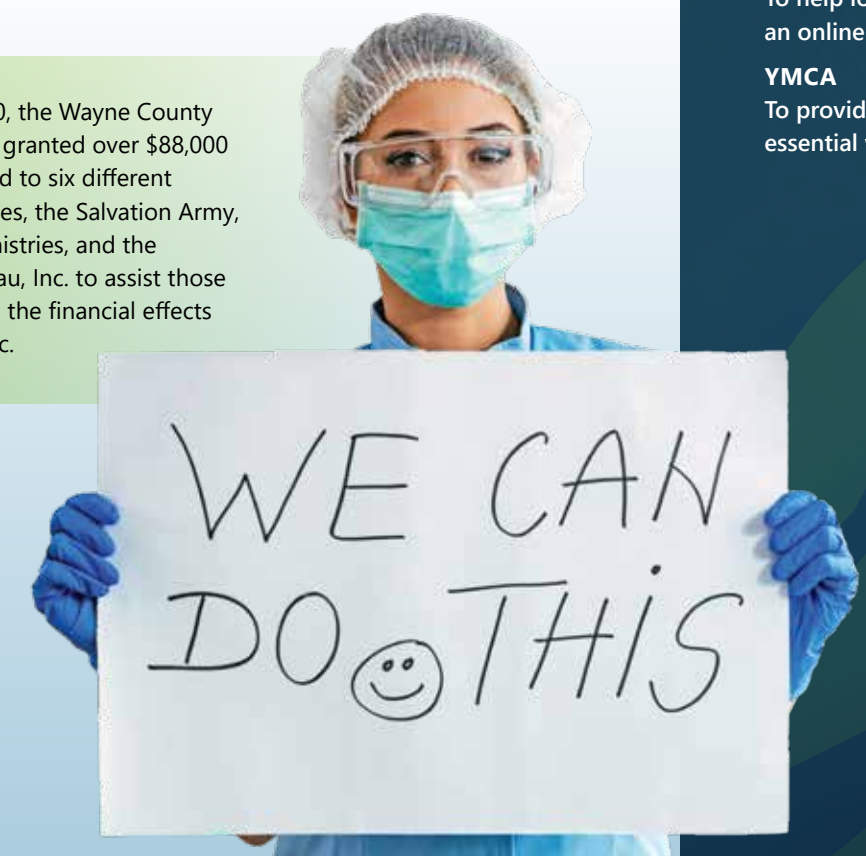

Since April 2020, the Wayne County Cares Fund has granted over \$88,000 to be distributed to six different township trustees, the Salvation Army, Open Arms Ministries, and the Children’s Bureau, Inc. to assist those struggling from the financial effects of the pandemic.

The Challenge Match is a community-wide fundraising effort that affords local nonprofit organizations the opportunity to raise operating dollars or money for special projects. 2020 marked the ninth time the program has been offered, proving once again to be a catalyst for philanthropic action in our county. For a nine-day period in November, 49 local organizations collectively raised \$1.57 million. This amount, plus the Foundation match, represents over \$1.83 million in total contributed benefit to the community.

### CHAMPION CAUSES AND COALITIONS

We are working with three strong groups: Employability, Early Childhood, and Neighborhood & Main Street Development.

### GRANTS

Through Coalitions and Forward Wayne County, we raised more than \$275,000 to support county priorities.

### EARLY CHILDHOOD SUCCESS COALITION

Starr and Vaile Elementary Schools in Richmond were awarded Paths 2 Quality Level 3 designation. This doubles the On My Way to Pre-K classes in Wayne County.

### PARTNER - NEXT LEVEL JOBS RAPID RECOVERY

We promoted and presented to employers, schools, and community partners on short-term credentials and certifications from Governor Holcomb's office.

*This supports the work of the Employability Coalition's goal to increase educational attainment rates of our residents.*

In the spirit of Wayne County Foundation founder Charles Rodefeld, someone who moved quietly but steadily to help meet community needs, it was our pleasure to present Monica Koechlein with the 2020 Charles A. Rodefeld Award for Leadership in Philanthropy and Community Service.

Monica, who was nominated by the both the Richmond Friends School and the Stamm Koechlein Family Foundation, is always one to tackle issues with a thoughtful, pragmatic, friendly, and collaborative approach. Her contributions to Wayne County are boundless. She is recognized as a leader who has a true passion for the community and one who works diligently to build strong relationships between young professionals and mentors. As the Executive Director of the Richmond Symphony Orchestra, Monica is a **fierce champion of the arts** in our community.

Additionally, she serves on the development committee for Richmond Friends School, and with the help of her vision and forward-thinking, the school developed the Scholarship Forward Initiative, a tuition assistance program.

Reverend Dr. Jeff Carter, Bethany Theological Seminary President, wrote that “**Monica creates positive change.** She expresses a commitment to our community through her support of local non-profits and leaders. # RUTH J. WICKEMEYER AWARD WINNER

Named for the Foundation’s first Executive Director, the Ruth J. Wickemeyer Award for Community Service recognizes paid or volunteer not-for-profit leaders who personify exceptional service to others in the name of community progress. In 2020, it was the Foundation’s pleasure to present the award to lifelong community servant and advocate Aileen Githens.

As a child, Aileen gathered milkweed pods for World War II lifejackets, which was among her first instances of serving others. She later taught business classes at Richmond High School for nearly thirty years.

Aileen, who was called a **‘volunteer extraordinaire’** by her recommenders, was nominated by the Civic Hall Associates where she serves as an usher. In addition to her volunteer work there, she is also actively involved at the Wayne County Tourism Bureau, Boys & Girls Clubs of Wayne County, Richmond Civic Theatre, and Central United Methodist Church.

In her nomination, Mary Walker, Executive Director of the Richmond-Wayne County Convention and Tourism Bureau wrote that “Aileen has long advocated for Wayne County, praising our communities’ wonderful treasures to countless visitors, from near and far, for well over 20 years. At the Tourism Bureau, she is passionate, engaging, and enthusiastic when greeting guests and always goes above and beyond to make their time here memorable and worthwhile.”

# LILLY ENDOWMENT

## 2020 Community Scholars

**T**he prestigious Lilly Endowment Community Scholarships are awarded annually to two graduating seniors from Wayne County high schools. The recipients are selected on the basis of their academic performance, a written essay, letters of recommendation, and their extracurricular activities.

Lilly Endowment Community Scholars receive a four-year, full-tuition scholarship and book stipend to the public or private Indiana school of their choice.

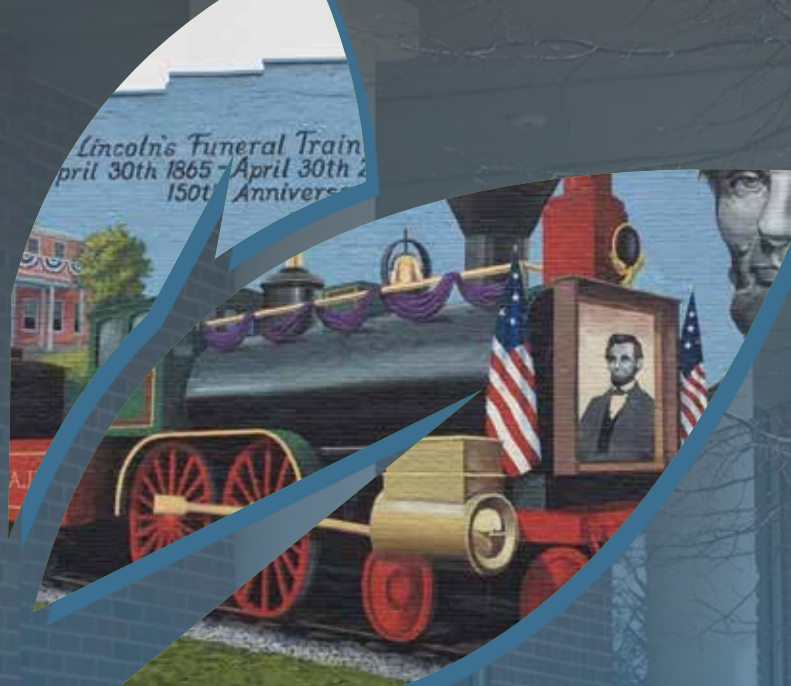
